2023 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence (25 November to 10 December)

Powys County Council are planning four white ribbon walks on Saturday 25 November to show their support for ending men's violence against women and girls.

They are being organised by the county council in support of the global White Ribbon movement, which this year is encouraging people to #ChangeTheStory on harmful gender-based behaviours and attitudes.

The walks are all due to start at 11am from the following venues:

- Lakeside Boathouse, Llandrindod Wells
- Dinas Road car park, Brecon
- Welshpool Town Hall
- Newtown Integrated Family Centre, Park Street

Refreshments will be available at the end of each town centre walk. They are also going to have a stand in Newtown during the day, raising awareness around violence against women, and hope to have a candlelight vigil in the evening.

Other Ways to Get Involved

- 1. Craft orange flowers, the campaign symbol, and display them in your local area, with labels that read #16days #nomoreviolence to raise awareness. Use your favourite technique to create the orange flowers: embroider them, macramé ornaments, make them from paper mâché, or crochet a brooch to send to an MP or other public figure. You can also wear orange to your November or December WI meeting or knit an orange scarf or hat for a candlelight vigil.
- 2. Support survivors by holding a candlelight vigil in your community. Invite members of the public, local organisations, and friends and family to show their solidarity with survivors.
- 3. Continue to support your local women's refuge. Collect donations to assemble care packages for the refuge or hold a fundraising activity and donate the proceeds. You can find details of local women's refuge providers at womensaid.org.uk/womens-aid-directory.

Resolution Shortlist 2023-24

The shortlisted resolutions are:

1. Dental Health Matters

There is a chronic shortage of NHS Dentists and people are suffering health issues as a result. The NFWI calls on the Government to increase investment in the training and retention of dentists and to review the current inadequate NHS contracts in order to ensure everyone can access an NHS dentist wherever they live.

2.Impacts of poor housing conditions

Poor housing can have a deleterious effect on human health and wellbeing, safety and quality of life and can disproportionately affect the most vulnerable groups in society. The NFWI calls on the UK Government to boost housing standards and regulations,

increase funding for housing renovations, increase the supply of affordable and secure housing and strengthen collaboration with local authorities, housing associations and other relevant stakeholders to develop strategies that address local housing challenges.

3. Say 'no' to gambling advertising

Harm caused by excessive gambling is a global problem. Some countries are already addressing this by banning advertising. The NFWI calls on members, the government, regulators, the NHS, educationalists and gambling charities to work together towards achieving a complete ban on gambling advertising. This will reduce gambling harm, save the NHS money, protect family relationships and decrease the number of suicides, around 400 per annum at present.

4.Improving Outcomes for Women in the Criminal Justice System

There is an urgent need to radically reform decision-making in respect of women in the criminal justice system and in particular, pregnant women and women with children. We urge cross-government collaboration to deliver on the 2018 female offender strategy by setting goals, robust governance and performance measures to reduce the number of women who have committed non-violent offences from being imprisoned.

Next steps - Every member now has the opportunity to cast their individual selection on the resolution they support the most. WIs are encouraged to hold meetings to provide members with the opportunity to discuss and learn more about each resolution. However, if this is not possible members can research the issues themselves and make their selection. The selection slip can be found in the November/December issue of WI Life. A copy of the selection slip can also be downloaded on this page.

The deadline for members' selections to reach their federations is 11th February 2024.
